

# Activity Consent

## Asthma, Anaphylaxis and Medication Management

Parents and guardians should note the following guidelines on the College's management of Asthma, Anaphylaxis and medications whilst on excursions and school camps.

- Students with Asthma or Anaphylaxis to please bring their own Asthma Inhaler (Spacer if required), and EpiPen from home.
- Student EpiPens stored at school will accompany teachers on excursions/camps to ensure each student has 2 EpiPens in the event of an Anaphylactic episode.
- Please ensure Asthma and Anaphylactic Action Plans are current in PAM or a hard copy provided.
- For overnight excursions/camps students requiring additional asthma medication other than Ventolin, must complete a School Camps & Excursion Medication form. (See attached)
- For day excursions the School Camps & Excursion Medication form is optional.
- Students wishing to take medication (Panadol, Antihistamine, Car Sickness tablets as examples) to please send medications in original packaging with a completed Medication Authority Form (See attached)
- For camps, any student with Diabetes will require a School Camp Action/Management Form. This will replace the Management/Action Plan that the school has on PAM whilst on camp as doses of insulin will change with the increase in activity and different foods students will be eating.
- Students with a medical condition who may require additional assistance whilst on camps/excursions, please contact the House Leader.

**Please note: Without the required forms/medication, your child will not be permitted to attend the excursion/camp.**

**Privacy Policy**

This may include to school service providers which provide educational, support and health services to the school, either at the school or off campus.

**Behaviour**

Should any behavioural issues arise, teachers will be supportive and try to resolve the issue in a restorative manner. However, a student may be sent home if the issue or behaviour cannot be resolved. If a staff member deems it necessary to remove your child from the excursion, you will be contacted and required to pick them up from the venue. If your child becomes ill during the excursion and cannot continue to participate, you may be contacted and required to pick them up from the venue.

**Cancellation**

If the excursion needs to be cancelled or altered at short notice to ensure the safety of students and/or due to circumstances beyond the control of the College, we will contact you to advise you of the alternative arrangements.
