Underground power cable works Cobblebank June 2025

We're upgrading our network to be ready for the growing needs of the community. In June this year we will be installing a new underground power cable to support construction of the Melton Hospital.

Works

The works will include installation of a new underground power cable on **Ferris Road and Bridge Road** (as per the map overleaf).

When

These works are currently scheduled to be completed between **Saturday 14 June to Tuesday 24 June 2025**.

The works will be completed between **7am to 5pm Monday to Sunday**.

Traffic impacts

- The left turn lane from Ferris Road (southbound) into Bridge Road will be closed. Drivers can still turn left from the centre lane.
- Local traffic, bicycle and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times with traffic control in place to safely guide motorists, cyclists and pedestrians around the work area.

What to expect

- Electricity supply will be maintained, there are no planned outages during these works.
- Works will involve open trenching, where parts of the road and footpath will be excavated. Additionally, underground boring will be carried out which will involve drilling into the ground with machinery.
- The noise associated with these activities may be loud at times.
- On completion of these works, any disturbed areas will be reinstated.
